How you can help your child:

- Read daily with your child including practicing high frequency words and tricky words. There will be one Little Wandle book a week for your child to read to you daily and another book your child has chosen from the school library for you to read to them. Please add a comment in the reading record everytime you hear your child read.
- To develop an understanding of a text, ask your child questions when reading e.g. Who were the main characters? What was the problem in the story? What did you like about the text?
- Practice handwriting and encourage your child to write shopping lists, letters, stories etc.
- Practice different maths topics we have covered so far e.g. number bonds to 10, addition and subtraction within 10, finding the difference.
