How you can help your child:

- Practice handwriting and encourage your child to write shopping lists, letters, stories etc.
- Practice different maths topics we have covered so far e.g. number bonds to 10 and to 20 and 50, addition and subtraction within 20, finding the difference.
- When playing games, incorporate maths; rolling a die, moving forwards and backwards, talking about time.
- Play numbots at home.
